Audits and Quality improvement projects

- I am proud that I have introduced some of the recent fracture management techniques and procedures to the orthopedic department of my previous hospital in Iraq (Nasiriya), those are the following
 - 1. Closed reduction percutaneous pinning of supracondylar humerus fracture in pediatric age instead of the old open reduction method.
 - 2. Use of MIPO techniques in treating comminuted fracture of long bones
 - 3. Closed locked Intramedullary nail fixation of tibia and femur shaft fixation instead of the old open reduction and plate fixation.
 - 4. PFN use to treat peritrocanteric fractures.
 - 5. Pelvic ring and acetabulum fractures fixation techniques
 - 6. TENS nailing of pediatric long bones fractures
